

Police Study Narcotics

Police Officer Glenn Fisher, a three-year veteran of the Farmington Dept. of Public Safety, has been named to attend a narcotics and drug abuse course at Oakland Community College Sept. 23-27.

The 40-hour course, co-sponsored by OCC and the Oakland County Prosecuting Attorney's office, will deal with the general problems of addiction to narcotics, search and

seizure, and surveillance and information.

Instructors are from the Alcohol and Tobacco Tax Division of the Treasury Department, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and the Federal Drug Administration as well as state and local agencies.

The impact drove her car across the middle line into a head-on collision with a car driven by Charles R. Curtis, 18, of 21110 Van Buren, Southfield.

He and his passengers, Ronald Anderson, 18, of 22190 Seminoe, Southfield, and Dan Trowbridge, 17, of 21641 Seminoe, Southfield, also sustained injuries.
