

RU Rips Thurston Eagles, 44-0

Quarterback Bill Herbert threw three touchdown passes and set up a fourth as Redford Union ambushed archrival Thurston, 44-0, in a non-league football contest on the winner's field.

IT WAS ALL Redford Union in the match between the two Redford Township schools, which has developed into an intense rivalry.

Herbert led the Panther surge by connecting on six of 11 passes for 124 yards. He suffered one interception.

Slymied all night, the best the Eagles could do was eke out four first downs, penetrate the Panther 40 only once and complete just two of 11 aerials for 19 yards. They had one pass stolen.

RU picked up its first score with 3:08 to go in the opening frame after Dennis Poppinger intercepted Herbert's pass on the Thurston five.

On a running play, Fritz

tackled Mark Miller in the Eagle end zone for a safety and two points.

Then the rout was on.

It took the Panthers 20 plays to produce their first TD with 8:05 left in the half, but their march was slowed by four penalties along the way.

With fourth and 15 to go, however, Herbert drilled a perfect pass to Randolph on the goal line.

The Panthers then made it 10-0 when Herbert lobbed an aerial into Naudi's arms for a two-point conversion.

RU COUNTEDED again with 22 conversions in the half. The fourth play TD march was set up when junior tackle Tom Tullock grabbed an Eagle fumble on the Thurston 25.

A 15 yard holding penalty against RU pushed the Panthers back to the 40, but three plays later Herbert and Naudi hooked up for a 33 yard bomb.

Richmond's kick split the uprights to hike the margin to 17-0 at halftime.

RU notched its third TD with 4:49 to go in the third stanza after the Panthers returned an Eagle punt to the Thurston 37.

With Mitchell picking up three nice gains, the Panthers moved the ball down to the 17 where Herbert teamed up with Naudi again for another six point aerial.

The score mounted to 24 to 0.

as Richmond's conversion kick cut the goal posts.

Two-and-a-half minutes later the Panthers tallied again. Junior linebacker Tom Burk made this score possible by stealing an Eagle pass on the Thurston 30.

HERBERT set up the score with a 25 yard pass to Naudi. Two plays later Booker bucked over from the three. RU failed to convert, making the margin 30-0.

With 4:17 to go, Booker took

junior tackle Jeff Smrcka's punt on the Thurston 32 and roared down the right sideline to paydirt. Richmond converted to make the score 37-0.

With most of the RU first string still in the game, the Panthers scored again with 1:05 to go.

The victory gave the Panthers a 5-3 won-loss record. They'll have a chance to better that when they wind up their season Friday against Farmington Harrison.

Ken Stupyra Stars In GC West Victory

If it's not a record... then one must go a long ways to top it.

Back Ken Stupyra carried 12 straight times and 14 out of 15 in a 60-yard touchdown march that helped Garden City West turn back Crestwood, 14-0, in West's tuneup for this week's clash with crosstown rival Garden City East.

To cap his succession of carries, Stupyra went the final three yards for a TD early in the fourth period, and then bucked over for the conversion to complete the evening's festivities.

In all in, the fleet West back carried 24 times and totaled 89 yards, as his team captured its third victory against five defeats.

THE FIRST West score had come near the end of the first period when Steve Jancuski smashed over on a 15-yard run after Gary Fielden, the West quarterback who plays linebacker on defense, came up with one of the fumbles his team covered during the game.

Fielden, who has sparked all season at quarterback, was magnificent against Crestwood on defense. Besides falling on the one fumble, he intercepted three of the five passes West pilfered during the evening, and also figured in eight tackles.

"That's a defensive performance hard to duplicate," said Coach Bob Draheim, who has watched his team improve in recent weeks and now is confident that West will make a strong showing against unbeaten, untied East.

"Earlier in the season, you'd have said our chances against East were slim. Things certainly have now changed in the last few weeks."

WHILE FIELDEN stole three Crestwood passes, Tom Wolfman and Ken Yeager each grabbed off one.

In the fumbles department, John Maggionella grabbed two, Fielden, Jim Watley and Jim Garland one each.

The fumble recovery that meant most for West came when Crestwood smashed down to the West one. Then on what appeared a sure touchdown drive, the ball slipped away from the West runner and West got it.
