Work progress will be checked and if developers do not meet the schedule of Improvements, additional permits may be withheld, according to the approved schedule. If the developers want to speed up construction of the multiple units, the proposal requires that permits for the final 200 units will not be issued until the golf course is in playing condition, even if it is before the three-year deadline.

Though the city's open space policy requires the establishment of an escrow account to cover 130 perent of the total cost of improvements, it will not be required for the golf

THAT'S BECAUSE the golf course is in addition to the regular open space and because golf course construction is expensive, requiring a large escrow account. In addition, the provision withholding bermits on the last 200 multiple units until the course is completed "ensures that the golf course would be completed in its entitrety before these units could be built," Blasell said in his report.

The city, Biasell continued, also does not want to be placed in a position of completing the golf course if developers default on the agreement.


