A 17-year-old man from Tampa, Fla., is charged with carrying a concealed weapon in Farmington Hills.

Arraigned Oct. 10 before Magistrate Dennis Phency of Farmington, the man stood mute to one count of carrying a concealed weapon. An in-recent plea was entered. Bond was set at \$2,500, pending a preliminary exam in 47th District Court. Conviction could bring a penalty of up to five years in prison and a \$2,500 fine.

According to the police report:
