

Students may study overseas

Qualified high school students are offered an opportunity to spend an academic year or summer holiday in Scandinavia, Germany, France, Switzerland, Britain, Holland, Spain, Australia, New Zealand or Canada (French or English speaking) as part of the ASSE International Student Exchange Program.

Students 15 to 18 years old qualify on the basis of academic performance, character references and a desire to experience life abroad with a

volunteer host family from Europe, Canada, New Zealand or Australia. ASSE families abroad are carefully screened to provide a caring environment in which students can learn the language and culture of their host country. Summer exchange students live with a family who speaks English. Year students need not have learned a foreign language as they receive language and cultural instruction as part of the ASSE program. ASSE students attend regular high

school classes along with their new overseas teenage friends. "ASSE exchange students learn by living the language and culture of their new host country," said Jodi Schmidt, Midwest regional director.

The non-profit, public benefit ASSE International Student Exchange Program is affiliated with the national Swedish and Finnish Departments of Education and is participating in the President's International Youth Exchange Initiative.

ASSE also provides international opportunities to families to host students from Scandinavia, Germany, France, England, Australia, Spain, USA/Canada, Japan and New Zealand. These select students are 15 to 18 years old and will attend the local school for an academic year.

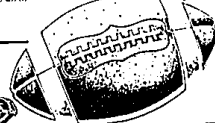

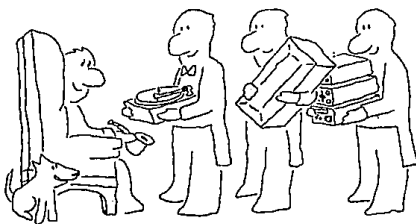

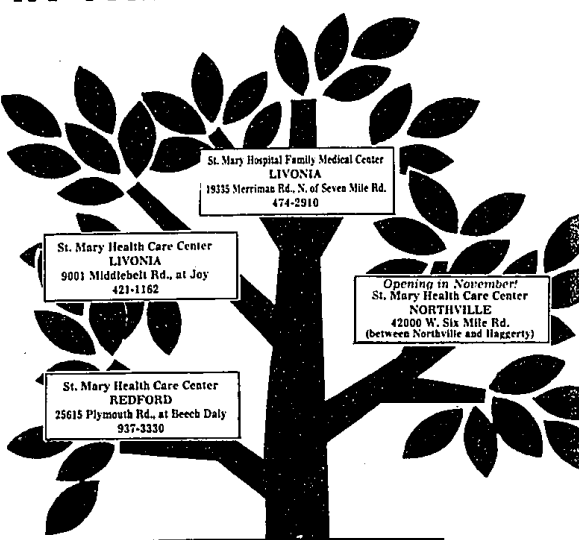
