

Hawks aim for victory No. 7 at N'ville

OBSEVERLAND is down to one undefeated football team with three weeks remaining in the regular season.

Farmington Harrison (6-0) is the only unbeaten team with a perfect slate after Westland John Glenn stopped North Farmington's streak at five last Saturday, 31-14.

Due to Glenn's victory, the suspense this week focuses on the Lakes Division of the Western Lakes Activities Association. Glenn, North and Livonia Stevenson have the same 3-1 records, and the final round of division play will produce either an outright champion, co-champions or, like last year, tri-champs.

Harrison, the top-ranked team in Class B, locked up the Western Division title and will oppose one of those teams next week for the WLAA crown.

Redford Catholic Central is in position to claim the Central Division title and a possible playoff berth after toppling Birmingham Brother Rice, The Shamrocks (5-1) must get past Notre Dame and DeLaSalle to maintain their hold on first place.

The battle between prep prognosticators saw O'Meara (12-2) break a stalemate with Emons (11-3) last week. Emons 65-22. Things could change this week since they disagree about the winner in five upcoming games.

Liv. Churchill at Ply. Canton: Churchill (3-3) can tie for second place in its division by winning, and Canton (2-4) can force a three-way tie for third if it's successful. Both teams are coming off losses, the Chargers getting steamrolled by Harrison and the Chiefs losing a squeaker to Franklin. Picks — Like England during the blitz, Churchill rebounds to victory, according to O'Meara. However, Emons sees Canton coming out ahead.

Ply. Salem at Liv. Stevenson: Tri-leader Stevenson (4-2) faces the roughest test in its hope of sharing the title. But the Rocks (4-2) can spot these plans and tie Stevenson for third place, or maybe even force a four-way tie should the other tri-leaders also lose. Picks — A tough one to call, but O'Meara gives the Spartans and their defense the edge. Emons says the Rocks are a solid choice.

Weld. John Glenn at Walled Lake Central: It would be a major upset if the Rockets (5-1), fresh from their stirring win over North Farmington, should lose to winless Central. The Vikings (0-6) have lost to follow Lakes tri-leaders North and Stevenson by a combined 71-0 the last two weeks. Picks — Supposedly weaker opponents (the Minnesota Twins, for example) can rise to the occasion, but Glenn suffers no letdown.

Farm Harrison at Northville: Harrison (6-0) has whipped its four division opponents, three by shutout. The combined

HARRISON 98, W.L. WESTERN 63: Danielle King's two individual wins and role in a relay victory sparked Farmington Harrison past the Warriors last Thursday.

King won the individual medley (2:43.3) and backstroke (1:13.2), and she, Elizabeth Tucker, Julie Farabee and Jenny Fitzgerald captured the medley relay (2:03.6).

Farabee also won the 50 freestyle (27.2) and joined with Jill Muray, Fitzgerald and Tucker for a victory in the freestyle relay (4:05.8).

Tucker also won the butterfly (1:07.2) and Fitzgerald the 100 freestyle (1:04.5). Harrison's Shawna Knight won the 200 freestyle (2:48.6) and Lisa Skibinski the breaststroke (1:25.6).

Harper Woods at Clarenceville: Not so long ago, Harper Woods (3-3) had one of the weakest programs in the state, but the Pioneers are playing respectably, 500 football. But Harper Woods is still no match for the Trojans (4-2), who could have a big night if things go right. Picks — The smart money says Clarenceville.

Redford Thurston at Taylor Center, 4 p.m.: The Eagles enter week No. 7 of the high school football season still looking for win No. 1. Victory eluded Thurston (0-6) in a 19-7 loss to Taylor Kennedy, and the Eagles will try their luck against another Taylor school this week. Picks — The Rams have a losing record at 2-4, but the Eagles are apt to remain winless.

Lutheran Wald, at Cardinal Mooney: The host Mount Clemens team should be no confused with Youngstown (Ohio) Cardinal Mooney. That would be sending David out against Goliath. But the Warriors (3-3) have fared well in their first season. Picks — It may not have the reputation of its Ohio namesake, but Mooney gets the nod.

North Farmington at Farmington: After suffering its first loss, North can gain a share of the Lakes crown with a successful rebound effort. Farmington's lone victory was over Walled Lake Central. Depending on the outcome of this week-end's action, the Raiders could still end

up in the WLAA championship game and/or the Class A playoffs. Picks — North spoils the Falcons' homecoming.

Walled Lake Western at Liv. Franklin: The Patriots (3-3) can claim second place in the Western Division, providing they beat the Warriors and Canton can beat Churchill.
