Agenda details for government meetings scheduled for this week follow. All meetings are open to the public:

The following public hearings are scheduled:

- A hearing of determination for road improvements in Meadowbrook Heights subdivision.
- Cluster site plan in an RA-1 zone on the west side of Halsted, between 12 and 13 Mile. Proponent: Marcello Veneziano. Owners: Dan Guy, Leon Max Stryer, Pamela Jacobs, Thomas Devereaux.
- Cluster site and open space plans in an RA-1 zone north of Freedom Road, between Drake and Gill

roads. Proponent and owner: Frank Milo, Milo Properties.
 • Rezoning from RA-1 to RC-2, housing for elderly at 35120 Freedom Road. Proponent: Paul Henrickson, vice chairman, FCA Senior Housing Corp. Owner: Adele Bark.
 • Rezoning from RA-4 to OS-1, business office at 31105 Greening, Farmington Heights subdivision. Proponent and owner: Robert Benjamin.

In other business, the council will consider a request to dispose of city property on Freedom Road, between Drake and Gill, as well consider an amendment to the 47th District Court budget.

Council is expected to change the zoning office name to code enforcement office and to consider approval of the final plat for Hunter's Pointe No. 6 subdivision and preliminary plat for Stratton Hill.

An amendment to the refuse collection and disposal budget will be considered as will award of bids for rock salt and sand chloride.

Council also will consider a request for transfer of ownership of the 1987 Class C licensed business at 38259 10 Mile, from Lim's Cuisine Corp. to Hunan, Inc. Mayor Ben Marks is expected to appoint members to the Committee to Increase Voter Participation.

The council will hear from city auditors Plante & Moran tonight, as they give the city's annual audit report.

Two requests involving signs are on the agenda tonight:

- Owners of Nelson/Ross Properties, developers of the Village Commons Shopping Center on Grand River, will petition the council to install a ground sign.
- The Downtown Development Authority is petitioning to install large canvas-type banners in the central business district.

Other items on the agenda include a request from 47th District Court for a budget increase, contractor payments for Chatham Hills streets and the historical museum driveway paving, the 1988 tri-party county road program, discussion of Halloween public safety measures, report on state legislation involving liquor licenses and bids for printing of the city calendar.

Also before council is a two-month financial report ended Aug. 31, 1987 and the building department's quarterly report from July-September.

A resolution considering approval of deferring payment of special assessments will also be considered.
