AP — A generation of affluent off-spring following in the footsteps of Yuppies has picked up a tag line of its own — "Skippies." School Kids with Income and Pur-chasing Power are an estimated 24 million strong — teenagers who are becoming one of the nation's most powerful consumer forces by spend ing an average \$51.20 a week each Mostly, they spend on theuselves. And spending among young people is up despite a teenage population that has decreased in numbers by 12 per-cent in the past 20 years and is ex-pected to continue to decline through 1992.
