Youth plant a living legend

One of the national projects for the Children of the American Revolution (CAR) this year is to plant a living legacy to the U.S. Constitution. This is part of the celebration for the Bicentennial of the United States Constitution.

The members of Lexington Alarm Society C.A.R. planted a red maple tree in Memorial War Park in Farmington. Money to purchase the tree was donated by members of Three Plains and Quakertown Chapters of DAR. Members of the society wrote their own dedication and conducted their ceremony. They learned that the Constitution lives on like a living tree.

Dedicating trees is not new to Lexington Alarm. In 1939 an oak tree was planted in Royal Oak and dedicated to the last visible portion of the Saginaw Indian Trail. This year a plaque about this tree was placed on the trail to help celebrate Michigan's Sesquicentennial.

C.A.R. members learn about their government, history, and conservation. They are all proud of their ancestors who fought in the Revolution. Part of the C.A.R. creed states: "As the boys and girls of 1776 took an active part in the war for Independence, so the boys and girls of today have a definite work to do for their country."
