Among the stand-out items offered by artists and craftsmen are weaving, leaded glass, woodcuts, jewelry, soft sculpture, pottery and stoneware.

shapes and forms in unusual plant materials, which can be used to enhance sale items," said Florence Smith, this year's chairman for the gardeners' booth. "We travel with clippers and an eagle eye."

pine cones, nuts, berries, weeds, seed pods, cattails, herbs and grapevines. Joan Scitturo, the club's workshop leader, collected an array of driftwood specimens from a secluded beach section along northern Michigan's Thunder Bay shoreline to add to the collection for the designers.

The gardeners have twisted, shaped and coaxed hearts, baskets and wreaths from grapevines and decorated them with the materials that have been collecting all through the year for the show and sale. Wreaths, as well as a large variety of one-of-a-kind centerpieces, can be used for many seasons, as well as many years.

**ALL PROCEEDS** from the sale are directed toward maintenance of the grounds and landscaping at O.E. Dunckel Middle School and The Five Senses Garden, on the grounds of Farmington YMCA, on Farmington Road north of 12 Mile Road.

O.E. Dunckel Middle School is on the north side of 12 Mile between Orchard Lake Road and Farmington Road. Admission to the show is free. Food will be available throughout the show hours.

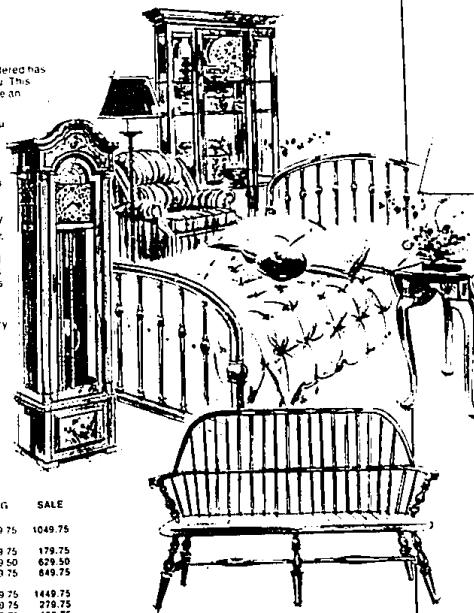
