

# Playoff picture brightens for OU kickers

Oakland University's soccer team got just what it wanted last week.

First, the Pioneers won twice, beating Lewis College 3-1 Saturday and Northern Kentucky 3-0 Sunday in the Central Region Classic hosted by OU. The victories were important, particularly the one over Lewis, which was ranked sixth in the Great Lakes Region entering the match — one spot behind OU.

But there's more. Two of the teams ranked ahead of the Pioneers in the region suffered setbacks last week. No. 4 Gannon University tied Canisius 3-3 and No. 3-ranked Northeast Missouri State was blanked by Quincy College 4-0.

Those results, combined with OU's

successes, pushed the Pioneers up to third in the region this week behind University of Missouri-St. Louis and East Stroudsburg. And the top three in the region are guaranteed NCAA Division II playoff berths. OU, with a 12-4-1 record, also leaped from 17th to ninth in the national poll.

Against Lewis, the Pioneers' Sel Eren busted out of a slump to score twice, and Earl Parris — voted the tournament's most valuable offensive player — added a goal and an assist.

PARRIS GOT OU on the board at the 17:21 mark on a setup from Erik Enyedy, who eluded defenders while advancing the ball into the Flyers' territory and then dropped a pass back to John Stewart. Stewart's long

pass up the middle reached Parris as he broke for the goal and beat Lewis keeper Jeff Baran.

The Flyers tied it just 2:33 later off a free kick 25 yards in front of the OU net. Sami Boudakh tapped the kick to Scott Gaitner, whose shot deflected into the goal off an OU defender.

OU took command after that, thanks to Eren, who had not scored since getting five goals in the first four games of the season. He got his first goal of the game following a throw-in by Brian Fitzgerald to Parris, who carried the ball down the wing into the corner, then crossed it to Eren for an open header at the far post.

Eren's second goal resulted after

Alan Stewart got control of the ball at midfield, dribbled through the Flyer defense and passed to Eren for a left-footed shot from 10 yards away.

Jeff Vakkarakas was in goal for the Pioneers and made two saves. OU outshot Lewis, 12-6, with Baran making five saves.

AGAINST NORTHERN Kentucky Sunday, OU completely dominated, outshooting the Norsemen 32-2. The Pioneers led 1-0 at the half on a Parris goal set up by Enyedy, who took the ball down the right sideline and centered it at 43:50. Alan Stewart made it 2-0 with 1:10 left in the opening half, drilling a free kick in from 25 yards away.

Parris got his third goal of the tournament with just under five minutes left, assisted by Simon Mayo and Tom Duff. Duff got the ball to Mayo at midfield, and Mayo sent a long pass down the right sideline to Parris, who outran the defense, cut in front of the net and scored.

The Pioneers hosted Central Michigan yesterday, then close out their regular season at Eastern Michigan Saturday. NCAA Division II playoff berths go out Sunday.

OU SHORTS: Tracey Jones was named to an all-tournament team for the third time this season as the Lady Pioneers finished 2-2 at the Ferris State Tournament last weekend.

OU lost to the host team, sixth-ranked FSC, 15-6, 13-15, 15-12, 15-10, and was beaten by Indiana-Purdue at Fort Wayne 17-15, 15-6, 15-11. In between, the Lady Pioneers defeated North Dakota 16-18, 15-8, 16-14, 15-2, and Lewis College — the ninth-ranked team in the NCAA II — 15-10, 15-11, 3-15, 15-11.

Jones totaled 55 kills in 116 attacks with 19 errors in the tournament for a .310 kill average. She also had six solo blocks and 26 block assists.

Holly Hatcher, a freshman hitter, was nearly as effective with 46 kills in 102 attacks with 14 errors (.314). eight solo blocks and 30 block as-

sists. Setter Kelly Williams also had 172 kill assists.

OU plays at Northern Michigan Friday and at Michigan Tech Saturday.

OU'S SWIM TEAMS opened their seasons well, particularly the men. The Pioneers finished with 234 points to win the nine-team Bowling Green State Relays Saturday. The Lady Pioneers finished third out of five squads in the BGSU women's relays.

Leading the men's effort was Mark VanderMey, who was in top shape in the season's first event. VanderMey qualified for the NCAA II championships in three events, going 46:52 in the 100-yard freestyle (leading off the 400 free relay), 1:41.72 in the 200 free (leading off the 800 free relay) and 57:43 in the 100 breaststroke (leading off the 300 breast relay).

OU won all three of those relays and seven others, finishing first in 10 of 14 events. Hilton Woods also qualified for nationals in the 50 free by leading off the 200 free relay in 21.24.

For the women, freshman Dana Kennedy (from Birmingham Groves) led off OU's first-place 200 free relay team in 24.50, which qualified her for the nationals.

OU's men's team swims at Grand Valley State Saturday, while the women are idle until Nov. 14, when they host Western Ontario.

## Sacred Heart wins 3rd field hockey title

Bloomfield Hills Academy of the Sacred Heart won its third Michigan High School Field Hockey Invitational Championship in four years Saturday.

Sacred Heart downed Ann Arbor Pioneer, 2-1, in the semifinals of the

11-team event, then beat Ann Arbor Huron in the finals, 3-1.

Sacred Heart was a co-host of the tourney, which was held at Cranbrook/Kingswood, along with University-Liggett and Dearborn Edsel

Ford. The teams were divided into two pools. The top two teams from each pool met each other in the semifinals. Sacred Heart was the only unbeaten and untied team to emerge from pool play.

Sacred Heart coach Cathy Driscoll announced special honors for four of her players.

Seniors Claudia and Ursula Petrozza of Bloomfield Hills were named First Team All-Stars. Claudia had previously been selected from

35 students across the United States to play on one of four field hockey teams at the Junior Olympics, which were held in Syracuse, N.Y., in August.

Senior Marguerite Stechschulte of Rochester Hills was named Second Team All-Star and junior Dana Decapite of Birmingham was named All-League Second Team goalie.

The honors are based on league play for the season preceding the tournament.

## Eagles cage opener

St. Mary's college men's basketball team opened its 1987-88 campaign with a 111-85 victory last week over Fanshawe College of London, Ont.

The Eagles started slowly by hitting just one of their first six field-goal attempts and fell behind, 7-4. However, St. Mary's rebounded to take a 53-42 halftime lead.

St. Mary's stretched its advantage in the second half after Fanshawe had closed the gap to six points.

The Eagles were led by junior James Curtis who had 19 points, seven rebounds, six assists and four steals.

St. Mary's next game is in the Gino's Pizza Classic Nov. 13-14 at Dombrowski's Fieldhouse.

Purdue University at Calumet squares off against Fanshawe in the first-round game. Tiffin University (Ohio) plays in the second game against the host Eagles. Game times are 7 and 9 p.m. The championship game will be played 3 p.m. Saturday.
