## For OCC, it's accreditation time again

Two years of preparation came to a head this week for Oakland Com-munity College.

munity College.

An accreditation team from the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools spent four days touring OCC's compuses and poring through the records of the 25-year-old community college.

"We're talking to faculty, to board members, to community leaders." said NCA team chair Vernon O. Crawley, president of St. Louis (Mo.) Community College at Forest Park.

Crawley declined, to recognition of the control of the college of the college of the control of the college of th

Crawley declined to reveal the team's assessments of OCC's "strengths" and "concerns," at least until a written report is handed over to Chancellor R. Stephen Nickolson.

Nevetheless, OCC is expected to win accreditation again, as it did in 1980 for a seven-year period.

ACCREDITATION is a system for recognizing institutions for their levels of performance and quality. More than a mark of confidence for educators, accreditation is also a sign to students that courses are worthwhite and credits transferable, and to employers that graduates are qualified.

And in order for a college to receive federal aid, it's legally necessary for it to be accredited by an agency recognized by the U.S. scere-tary of education.

"In most countries, a central government hieral does accreditation," said OCC's Nicholson. "In the U.S., the system is more decentralized."

There are three types of accredi-

tations: 1) for an entire institution, such as OCC is undergoing: 2) for a particular service, such as OCC reently won for its counseling department; and 3) for graduate programs.

ment; and 3) for graduate programs.

NONE OF the accrediting team can be an OCC graduate or a recent employee of the college, under NCA rules.

All must be from out of state. Of the elght members who visited this week, five are men and three are women; three are presidents, four are top-level administrators, and one sa department head.

They hall from two-year colleges in Warrensville Township, Ohioo Des Moines; Greeley and Westminster. Colo.; Des Plaines, Ill. Omaha. and Kansas City. Mo.

NCA covers 19 states, including most Great Lakes states, and its ju-

risdiction stretches from West Vir-ginia to Arizona. Headquarters is in Chicago.

NICHOLSON SAID the accredita-on process has evolved over the

Rather than making mechanical counts of library books and facilities, accreditation teams today look at an institution's goals, study how it targets its service area, check how resources are matched to the tasks, and evaluate whether its success is likely to continue.

Crawley said the final NCA report may take weeks to write. It will cover 13 areas.


