Fox says she spent \$3,000 on campaign

Newly elected Farmington Hills councilwoman Jean Fox said Friday she collected more than \$5,000 for her campaign, but spent only a little more than \$3,000 on actual cam-

HENCE, SHE sald, it was necessary to open a bank account in September with \$4,000 of her own money, listed on her report as "loan from a person."

Donations of \$15, \$25 and \$50, "with an occasional \$100 or \$150," followed as did a fund-raiser, Fox

said. In the final accounting, the seed money loan will be returned to her. "When the final accounting is turned in to the county clerk, expenses in the Fox campaign should run about \$3.000, 90 percent of it financed by small donations," she said.

Fox said her printing costs topped \$1,500; another \$1,000 went for stamps. She said she decided that di-rect mall would be her main source of contact with voters.

Council candidates are required by state law to file pre- and post-election financial reports with the county elections elect if they collect or spend more than \$1,000. Candi-dates must file a post-election report by Dec. 3, shawing a complete list of campaign receipts and expenses.
