Mischakoff Stars With Symphony

Mischa Mischakoff has chosen the romantic and beautiful concerto for violin and orchestra in G minor by Bruch for his guest appearance Sunday afternoon with the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra. The concert will be given at 4 p.m., Nov. 22, in Plymouth Central High School, Main St., Plymouth.

Mischakoff retired as concertmaster of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra in 1967 after a 30 year international concert career.

He graduated at the age of 16 from the St. Petersburg Conservatory. He escaped from Russia in 1921 and emigrated to the U.S., where he soon became concertmaster of the New York Symphony under the late Walter Damrosch. His brilliant career has included the first chair of the Philadelphia Orchestra under Leopold Stokowski and 15 years with the NBC Symphony as Toscanini's "third hand."
