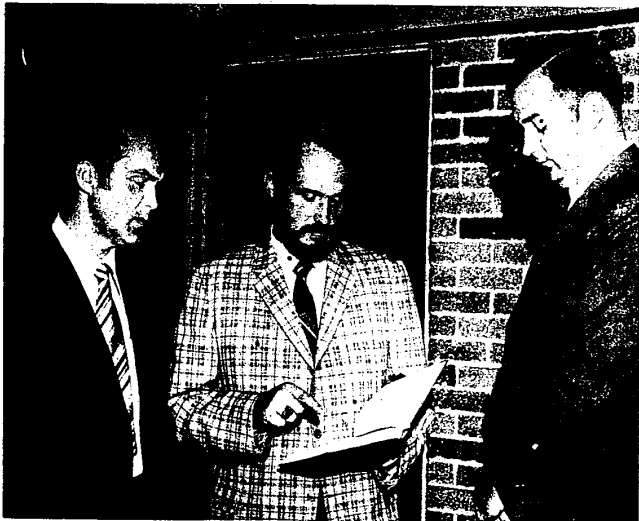

## O.E. Dunckel Principal Pinpoints His Goals

FARMINGTON Gil Henderson, new principal at Dunckel Junior High School, is no stranger to school administration. A resident of Novi, he's a member of the school board there.

Since 1966, Henderson has been assistant principal at East Junior High. Now he replaces Derby Dustin who retired in June.

"I find the change professionally stimulating," Henderson said. "One of a principal's chief jobs is to listen — to get feedback from staff, parents and students. In this way, he can anticipate problems and be a year behind and merely reacting to them. If he should get into that position, he spends all his time just putting out brush fires."

"The time has come to include students in more of the decision-making," he added. "We'll attempt to do this in a number of ways."

ASKED IF HE considered the guidelines of the Family Life Education Committee on substance abuse, human sexuality and minority understanding to be problems of the immediate future, Henderson replied that the schools have already been using many of the suggested approaches in the first two areas.

"We have always integrated teachings on sex education and substance abuse into our curriculum in a very natural way," he said. "As for minority understanding, I think all of us need a great deal of improvement."

Some of Henderson's ideas that he's anxious to try as chief administrator of a school naturally involve the techniques of teaching. He considers himself to be, first of all, a teacher but teaching different groups, staff rather than students.

He thinks small conference groups more valuable than large staff meetings. Role playing can help solve questions relating to parent-teacher conferences or other situations involving human understanding, Henderson said.

ANOTHER OF Henderson's chief concerns really boils down to an old-fashioned term, character building.

## Township Police Hire 3 Recruits

FARMINGTON Farmington Township's Police Department increased its ranks by three men, bringing the total number of policemen to 40. They will assume duty Nov. 30, according to Lt. William Kelly.

The new patrolmen are John P. Kohls, 29; Clifford A. Stryk, 28; and Jerry McKenzie, 32.

KOHL'S BRINGS over eight years experience to the township police force and is presently assigned to the Detroit Police Department's Youth Bureau.

Graduated from St. Theresa High School and the Detroit Police Academy, Kohls is married and the father of four children.

STRYK, also with the Detroit Police Department's Youth Bureau for 7½ years, is married and the father of two children.

He graduated from Walled Lake High School, the Detroit Police Academy, and attended Lawrence Institute of Technology.

McKenzie is assigned to the road patrol of the Wayne County Sheriff's Department where he has worked for 4½ years.

McKenzie earned his diploma at Lake Woods High School, then attended the Detroit Police Academy where he took special courses in homicide, investigation and radiological monitoring. He spent the next three years with the Dearborn Heights Police Department.
