Gottlieb's two cluster houses, built at least 1½ years ago, are on the east side of Orchard Lake Road, between 10 and 11 Mile.

The consent judgment allows Gottlieb to build a maximum 20 units on the acreage, a few units less than allowed under the RA-3 zone.

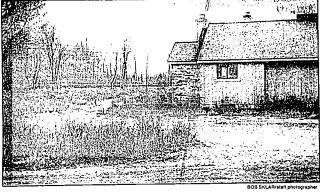
been accepted. He also reminded the council that Gottlieb violated the open space plan because he knocked down trees.

Soronen said the only way to guarantee that property will not be developed is for the city to buy the

land. "When someone buys the property, they have the right to use it according to the master plan."

Alkateeb told the council that to oppose the consent judgment would be the same as voting for the higher building density RA-3 zone, as shown in the master plan.

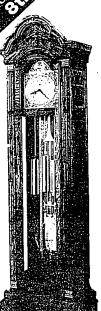

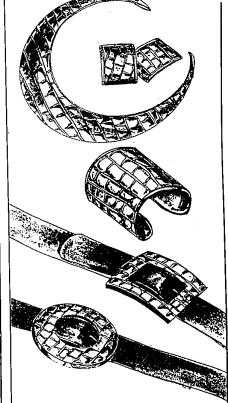
