Holiday appetizers are easy and elegant

Judy Antishin, cooking instructor and lecturer known throughout the metro area, returns to Farmington Community Center with her classic holiday session, "Easy and Elegant Appetizers." The how-to demonstration and sampling session begins at 7:30 p.m. Monday, Nov. 30, and is repeated at the same time Wednesday, Dec. 2.

Antishin will be doing the repeat because one is never enough. The one-time-a-season offering is always sold out.

"Class sizes are always limited to 60 people, although one year we had 145," she said. "It will be the same class with the same recipes, but this way I can reach more party cooks." "Easy and Elegant Appetizers" was the first attempt Antishin made

to teach and share her culinary treats. She has never used a recipe twice from one holiday season to the next, but the format is the same. She combines three hot and three cold appetizers with two different kinds of punch.

She prepares the dishes while she lectures. The holiday table is spread with her own china, crystal and punch bowls. Then the class shares in their first cocktail party of the season.

THE FORMAT IS her own, a method she uses, she says, "to give a cooking class a new twist and shine." Her enthusiasm for preparing new food combinations and sharing what she has either learned or devised herself is reflective of her art and

music talents.

"I offer more than spreads and dips to give life to your cocktail party," she said. "These are appetizers for the '80s."

Among the new recipes for this season are shrimp balls in sweet and sour sauce, burgandy beef and white zinfandel punch.

Fee for the session is \$10, which includes take-home recipes. Registrations are taken in the center, 24705 Farmington Road. Or they will be taken by phone in the center, 477-8404, with Master Charge or Visa.

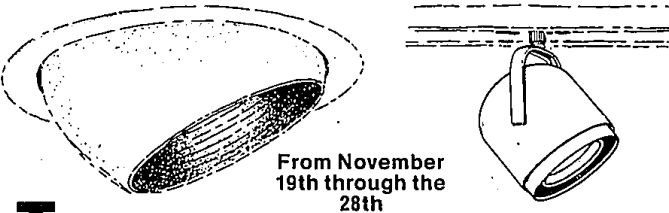
