## Birmingham Temple's '87 show promises to be 'the best ever'

**M**ONTE NAGLER, whose most recent one-man exhibit in Somerset Mall featured his "Back Roads of Europe" series, moves the exhibit to Birmingham Temple this month for the temple's 15th Invitational Art Show.

"It promises to be the biggest and best event ever," said Pera Kane, one of the show's committee members. "More than 100 invited artists will display their select works in painting, water color, sculpture, jewelry, ceramics, glass, weaving, soft sculpture, basketry, metal art and of course, Nagler's outstanding photography."

Nagler is Farmington-Farmington Hills' Artist-in-Residence this year.

who has traveled the globe for material for his camera shots. "Back Roads of Europe" was shot in eight countries this summer.

"The goal," he said, "was sights and scenes off the beaten tourist paths. Pictures of places most Americans would never see on tours."

He achieved the goal in a gamut that ran from little-known hidden seacoast villages to high into the Alps.

The Farmington Hills resident is a University of Michigan graduate engineer who switched careers in the

1970's to work with his camera. His photographs are included in collections of the Detroit Institute of Arts, Brooklyn Museum and Center for Creative Photography.

He teaches photography at Cranbrook, Birmingham Community House, Farmington Community Center and Southfield Cultural Arts Department. He also writes a column for Observer & Eccentric Newspapers.

NAGLER JOINS the show's artists from 9-11 p.m. Friday, Nov. 20

when they will greet the guests during the preview in Birmingham Temple, 28611 12 Mile Road. Guests may enjoy wine and cheese and live music as they view the exhibits for a \$5 contribution.


The show continues from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday and Sunday, Nov. 21-22. Admission is free until noon each day. A \$2 admission charged will be asked after noon.

Suzanne Velick is the Birmingham Temple member who developed the art show from simple beginnings to prominence in 10 years.

Sharon Klein is successor chairwoman for the third year "who will again fill every nook and cranny of the attractive and adaptable building with quality art," Kane said.

Birmingham Temple will be celebrating its 25th anniversary in 1988. It is the seat of Humanistic Judaism,

founded by Rabbi Sherwin Wine. The movement expanded nationally and internationally until, in 1985, the International Institute for Secular Humanistic Judaism was established in Jerusalem to serve as the intellectual center of the secular Jewish world.


