The residents were told the city will continue to hold the line on costs

and that some statements made by residents about ditching were inaccurate, he added.

The Meadowbrook Heights Issue prompted councilman Terry Sever to ask for a review of the city's paving policy, particularly the residents petitioning process.

"... we've had Issues that have dragged on for months," Sever said, adding that even when more than 51 percent of the residents favor paving, there's often delays and counter petitions presented because some people change their minds.

But councilwoman Jody Soronen told Sever that the delays and counter petitions are a city council problem, not an administrative problem. The petitioning policy is expected to be reviewed at a future all-day city council work session.
