Liquor license extended again

The Arboretum Office Park along the 12 Mile office corridor has received a third two-year extension on a Class C liquor license for a long-anticipated restaurant.

The Farmington Hills (Younell New 28) agreed for the glass license on the control of the liquor license for a long-anticipated restaurant is expected to be completed by late 1989, early 1980.

The extension was not unanimous with counciliann Aido Vagnozzi oposed to holding the license for the office divelopment for two years. He asked for a one-year extension followed by a review.

"I don't see the need for a two-year extension. This would give them a full six years (that the license was first held in reserve in March 1984 in anticipation that the planned restaurant would be in operation by March 1986.

Though councilwoman Jean Fox said, "I think it's unfair to hold it up for five years," she voted with the majority.

COUNCILWOMAN JAN Dolan

told Vagnozzi that Peter Burton, one of the Arboretum's developers, made it clear the restaurant would be years in the offing when he asked for license reservation.

"We knew at the time it would take several years," she said. One other Class C license that was reserved for Etkin Equities for the Brooklield office development on Northwestern Highway, has been re-turned, city clerk Joan Reynolds said.

Two of the planned six three-story buildings of the Arboretum Office Park on 50 acres on 12 Mile, between Drake and Farmington roads, are complete and occupied.


