# State-paid AIDS tests in Senate bill

An AIDS prevention bill last week Sailed through the Michigan Senate with no debate but lots of explanation. This week it goes to the House Off Representatives. "It has consumed an enormous amount of work over a couple of Years," said Senate Majority Leader John Engler, R-Mount Pleasant. SPONSOR William Sederburg, R. East Lansing, said the bill takes nine items toward containing and curing steps toward containing and curing according to a for incurable disease fransmitted through bedily fluids, either sexually or intravenously.

"We need to find ways to prevent and treat It." he said.
While only 461 persons in Michigan now have it, Sederburg said, that is expected to rise to 3,500 by 1991 and ultimately to 18,000.

At a cost of \$50,000 each for care, AIDS victims will cost society \$900 million and the state Medicald budge of \$150 million, he said.

Programs costs were not included in the bill. Sederburg said they will be covered by a trust fund. It will be financed by a cigarctic tax increase bill and a tax on smokeless (chewing) tobacco expected later this year.


