**TV TIPS**

Parents need to be concerned about the quantity and the quality of the TV shows their children are watching. Research shows that when children spend more than ten hours a week watching television important learning experiences such as doing homework, reading a book or engaging in physical activity are eliminated. Yet, the average child watches 25 hours of TV a week. That's more time than some children spend in the classroom!

Here are some helpful hints that will assist parents in planning the amount of television their children will watch and in selecting quality children's programming:

- 1) On Sunday, plan with your children which shows will be viewed during the week. Limit the number of selections. Select programs based on your children's ages, interests and educational needs.
- 2) Watch TV with your children. Discuss what's "real" and "unreal" on television and in life.
- 3) Plan family activities other than watching TV.
- 4) Turn the TV off during dinner.
- 5) Encourage children to do their homework before they watch TV.
- 6) Make yourself aware of the TV shows available on Public Broadcasting Systems. PBS has high quality programs for children of all ages which appeal to a variety of student interests and cover many different subject areas.

Parents can turn TV watching time into quality time for children when these guidelines are implemented in the home.
