WHEN IS MY NEXT APPOINTMENT?

How often you should see your doctor depends on the severity of your arthritis and the therapy you are receiving. If your arthritis fluctuates between extremes of flares and remissions, you should be seen once a month. This allows your doctor to intervene before the arthritis gains momentum. Or, you may have only a few joints involved, but they are stubborn and resist therapy. Then repeat aspiration of these joints, on a monthly basis, may lead to control of the inflammation. Often monthly visits are in order because the medication requires such surveillance to monitor for untoward side effects. If you have rheumatoid arthritis and are receiving gold injections, then weekly appointments are necessary for the five months duration required to receive the full course of therapy. Return appointments also are determined by individual circumstances. For instance, consider an elderly individual, dependent on others for transportation, and concerned about the safety of walking out on an ice morning. At this time of year, this person may manage with a return appointment in three or four months, while any problem other than an emergency is handled by phone.

At Botsford

20-bed rehabilitation center is dedicated

Botsford General Hospital officially marked the opening of its \$1.3 million, 20-bed self-contained Inpatient Physical Rehabilitation Unit Friday.

A private ribbon-cutting ceremony marked the opening of the unit, part of Botsford's new Phase II addition. Botsford employees were invited to tour the new unit after the short ceremony. A larger communi-

tywide open house is planned for 1988.

The new inpatient physical rehabilitation unit demonstrates Botsford Hospital's commitment to improving the quality of life of those with temporary, progressive or permanent disabilities," said director Edwin Eggleston.

Dr. Victor Gordon, a Botsford physiatrist, is medical director of the

new unit.

The unit will serve a variety of patients, from those suffering the effects of a stroke or arthritic conditions, to neurological disorders and multiple traumas. Its purpose is to help patients maximize their potential and reintegrate them into the community, working within their scope of limitations.

An aspect of the unit is that it is

self-contained and will use a team concept. It will allow patients to receive comprehensive, individualized treatment such as physical and occupational therapy, nursing care and social work intervention, while remaining on one floor and working with a team of professionals. 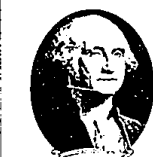
