WHEN SOMEONE cries out, "red-bellied woodpecker," we know he's referring to a bird. But it is someone cried out, "I found a spatial den-drite," would you know what he had found? If you were a snowlake fancier, you would.

It you would. As the season of snow approaches, identifying different snowflakes may be as much fun as identfying birds. With the use of an inexpensive hand lense a new world of beauty, shape and form can be discovered.

JUST AS birdwatching has field

guides to help identify birds, Edward R. LaChapelle has developed a field guide to anow crystals. It's not necessary to learn the 80 different types of snow crystals that have been classified, but a twe basic types will suffice to get started. All snowflakes begin developing around a minute dust particle in a cloud. Water forms arout the parti-cle and begins to crystalize. Where the crystal starts forming will deter-mine what kind of crystal is formed initially.

Column crystals with stellar crys-tals at both ends form another "hy-brid" known as a tsuzumi crystal.

MANY SNOW crystals have min-ute beads of lee on them. This is called rime. If the flake is covered beyond recognition with rime, it is then known as graupel. Examining snow crystals that fail on your glove with a hand lense is an enlightening caperience. They may not last long, but before they melt, you will find a hidden world of deli-cate dentrites.
