Woodwind quintet music is bright
and fun, an attribute reflected in
their rendition of the British composer Maleolm Arnold's 1982 composition Sea Chanteys for Wind Quintet. The plece has a contemporary
sound but a swing in the changing
rhythms that make it appealing. The
Kingston Trio hit "Early in the
Morning" is only one of the fishing
melodies used by Arnold. More striking is the way Arnold features each
instrument.

ALTHOUGH BARTOK is famous for his collection of Hungarian folk tunes, the Five Hungarian Folk Songs performed by the Renaissance

Woodwind Quintet were composed by Ferink Furkas. Easily this work is one of the most distinctive pieces for woodwind quintet. This critic has heard it often performed and found this performance very pronounced and punctuated. The harmonic blend

this performance very pronounced and punctuated. The harmonic blend in the second movement is especially invoking although it was the last movement rhythm that made it especially alturing to the audience.

In the spirit of the season, the concert ended with Schiffman's contrapuntal arrangement of Christmas carolis. From each of the five instruments a Christmas melody is heard, "God Rest Ye Merry Gentlemen' predominated in harmony with "The FITS Noel," "Oh Christmas Tree," and ending with "We Wish You Merry Christmas."

In settings such as the Farmington Community Center, chamber music is certainly at its best. The Renalisance Woodwind Quintet was also at its best, taking full advantage of the small intimate setting to make their music even more enjoyable.
