## Meal of green and white suggested for MSU fans

It's New Year's Day and the family is gathered around the television set. Why? Michigan State is playing in the Rose Bowl. If you didn't get the chance to travel west for the big game, why not get the spirit at home by serving a green and white luncheon?

"Traditionally when planning a meal you would want to include a variety of colors. Planning a green and white menu on New Year's Day is the exception," says Linda Exum, Oakland County home economist. "You should still select foods from the four food groups so that a balanced meal is obtained."

Go through your cookbooks and recipe files to find foods that are green and white, she suggests. For an appetizer try a fresh vegetable tray using green peppers, celery, broccoli

and olives. As a white accent, use cauliflower and serve with yogurt dip. Follow with a hot bowl of soup such as cream of broccoli or split pea soup with a dollop of cream.

Some suggestions for white meats are chicken, turkey or fish. Choose a green vegetable topped with a white sauce to accompany the meat.

Add to this meal a tossed green salad with dressing or green Jello with pears. If you need to prepare your meal ahead of time, make a casserole using a white meat and a green vegetable and freeze.

Sandwiches could be made from chicken or turkey topped with Green Goddess dressing or green pickle relish accompanied by chips and avocado or guacamole dip.

For dessert or a snack during the football game, try some tempting green and white sweets. Key lime pie, vanilla ice cream with creme de menthe, grasshopper pie or football shaped sugar cookies topped with green icing.

Carry through with the theme by decorating your table accordingly. Since it's holiday time, green and white accessories are available for a reasonable price. Have fun with the luncheon and be creative.
