

'Y' of it is a step up for Lockman

Janet Lockman will move down the road from the Farmington Area YMCA to the executive director's post at the Wayne-Westland Family Y next month.

Lockman will succeed Iwa Stacy, who left the Wayne-Westland executive director's job in November for a similar job at the South Oakland Y in Royal Oak.

Lockman, 31, said last week she was looking forward to the promotion, which is effective Monday, Jan. 25.

The Wayne-Westland Y also serves Garden City and Canton Township.

Lockman is moving up to the executive director's position after serving for three years at the Farmington branch as senior physical and membership marketing director.

Previously, she worked for five years at the Muskegon Y.

"This is the next step for me," Lockman said. "It's a chance to run the whole show."

Lockman said she has already met with the Wayne-Westland staff and the Y board of directors to begin preliminary discussions on plans and programs at the branch for the coming year.

ONE MAJOR project, she said, would be implementation of an

"Invest in Youth" campaign. The fund-raising project is designed to help disadvantaged families participate in Y programs. The campaign is being instituted at Y branches across the country, Lockman said.

Although the "Invest in Youth" program will concentrate on preschool and elementary school children, older children and handicapped adults will be eligible.

"The goal is to see that nobody is denied access to the Y," she said.

A native of Muskegon, Lockman earned her bachelor's degree in finance and education at Central Michigan University, where she majored in biology and economics.

After one year as a teacher for Grand Rapids Public Schools, she returned to her hometown as a aquatic director for the Muskegon Y. She later became the branch physical program director.

LOCKMAN SAID the career change from teaching allowed her to "be with more people, affect more lives."

She said she likes the faster pace of life in the Detroit area as opposed to northern Michigan.

Lockman lives in Farmington but said she would consider relocation to be closer to her new post once she is settled into the job.
