The \$24.3 million budget will put less emphasison land acquisition and more on development, he said, continuing the trend as the agency matures. The 66 capital projects will absorb \$4.4 million or 18 percent of the budget. Land acquisition will take nearly \$2700,000. Operations will cost \$12.1 million or 50 percent of the total - "about the level it's been running the last live or six years," Wahl said.
