DWYER PROMISED that this year will be "a big year for the Farmington Illits Police Department in providing drug education, in making the public more aware about the narcotics problem." Plans, he said, are in the works for a major community drug awareness nusth.

The Michigan State Police will oversee SEMCO. Unit members will include officers from other narcottics enforcement teams and police agencies as well as the FBI and the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office.

"It'll involve any government agency that's needed to suppress an arrotites conspiracy. Working together: that's the key," Dwyer said.

A conspiracy is an agreement between two or more people "to commit a crime in consort," Hedrick said.

What he likes about developing conspiracy cases "is that investigators have a lot more leeway because mere knowledge of a crime being committed is enough to bring a person into a conspiracy. In other types of cases, that may not hold true."

IN SELECTING investigators.

IN SELECTING investigators, SEMICO commanders looked for offi-cers "who have a background in con-spiracy and financial investigations as well as white-collar crime," Hedrick said.

Hedrick said he gained experience

Hedrick said he gained experience in all those areas during 19 years of service with the Farmington Illils Police Department.

His credentals include work in the Detective Division and as commander of the undercover officers who make up the Special Patrol Operational Team (STOT). He also worked on the Oakland County Child Kilter Task Force.

on the Oakland County Child Kitter Task Force. His background includes coopera-tive investigations with the Michigan State Police, the FBI and the Drug Enforcement Administration. Hedrick was transferred from the road paried to the Juvenile Division in mid-1987.

A three-year federal grant will pay 75 percent of the wages for each SEMCO member. In Hedrick's east, the Oakland County Narcottes Enforcement Team will pay the other 25 percent, Dwyer said.

The grant stipulates that Hedrick must be replaced by a new hire. In early spring, Dwyer said he plans to promote the next person eligible to sergeant and hire a new police officer.

transparent lining in the back of
the eye (similar to film in a camera) that light images pass through
in order for the optic nerve "to
see" objects. If the retina is damaged, bindness can result, Diabetic
retinopathy is the leading cause of
blindness in people 20-75 years of
age.

WILCOX WAS enrolled in an

WILCOX WAS enrolled in an evening government-spansored drafting class in Ferndale at the time his eyes "started to act a little funny." Like many diabetics who have diabetic retinopathy, he had no apparent symptoms prior to his eyes becoming blurry. "I kept putting off going to an ophthalmologist because I had no insurance, money was tight and I had no reason to believe my eyesight was in danger. I was extremely aware of the possibility of diabetes affecting my kidneys, but I didn't know it could also lead to blindness," he said.

Wilcox eventually went to see an ophthalmologist when the blurriness started to affect his drafting and he had to drop out of night school. His ophthalmologist referred him to Dr. Mark Halmann, an ophthalmologist who specializes in retinal disorders through the Retina Consultants of Michigan, Southfield.

Halmann began treating Wilcox with laser treatments in his office

Wilcox's eyesight began to slow-ly improve during the spring and summer of 1986.
"My attitude became more positive as well," he said, "I was able to help around the house and actually think about the possibility of working again. I called the drafting school, explained my situation and they allowed me to enroll in the class again even though you're only supposed to take it once. My eyesight continued to get better and this time I was able to make it through the whole course."

IN FARMINGTON Public Schools, high school students are required to take three years of English, two years of secienc, two years of math, 2th years of social studies and 1th years of physical education. Both foreign language and fine arts courses are offered but as electives. A committee is studying Farmington's social studies curriculum at all grade levels this year, and is expected to recommend an increase in high school requirements, according to White. The recommendations will be in the "debate stage" this year. High school science requirements were increased two years ago, and are still being reviewed.

Bennett estimated only 15 percent of high school siduents are completing the equivalent of his suggested curriculum. Seven schools, none from Michigan, were profiled in the report as examples of such a curriculum.

White said most districts use fed-

white said most districts use federal and state reports, such as Bennett's, help to "generate dialogue and discourse."

"That's very healthy. We always need to ask where we stand with other schools in the nation."
