"Besides that," adds Mrs. Hoskins, "I can't speak and still qualify for ADC. They deduct whatever I make from what they give me."
Her children many times attend school without proper clothing. "Now my girls' tennis shoes are wearing out, but she AINT gonna go to school barefoot."

AS REPORTED in the first article in this series, only about 14 percent of the homes in Section 36 are listed as dilapidated and about 6 per cent as deteriorating.
About 11 percent of the families living in Section 36 earn less than \$3,000 a year which is the income poverty level.

comprises only a small percentage. Most low-income homes are well kept and the section does include \$30,000 to \$25,000 homes.
But the sub-standard housing is concentrated within an area of a few blocks, forming a poverty pocket within the one-square-mile area. And this pocket is the largest concentration of poverty in western Oakland County.

MANY OF THE women blame society's seeming lack of concern for their situations.
"So many people have lost human interest," says Mrs. Gendron. "When they live on a high hill in a nice house, they don't have to look out their back window at the ugly side of life."
"If they close their eyes, they can't see it and think they don't have to help their neighbor."
