During the Court of Honor ceremonies in First Presbyterian Church of Farmington, Bodoh was presented to his friends, family and troop members by John Farley, executive board member of Clinton Valley

Council, Boy Scouts of America. Bodoh is a freshman at University of Detroit High School and has been a member of Troop 179 since 1984. He has served the troop as patrol leader, quartermaster, scribe and drill instructor. He is a member of Order of the Arrow and has received 26 merit badges and eight skill awards.
