

Cable crews hone skills at Constitution forum

"The Right to Bear Arms" was a community forum sponsored by the Farmington Area Committee on the Bicentennial of the U.S. Constitution. Sunday found approximately 160 people participating.

Our staff from the Southwestern Oakland Cable Commission covered the event for television on channel 12. Our intent to demonstrate "how to do video" proved most helpful. Two Oakland Community College people helped as crew as OCC faculty looked on to observe the technical intricacies.

This is a very great part of our roll besides overseeing the franchise. We are very happy to work with you personally to help walk through the first time experiences in television. The training for the public in television and radio is free. Workshops are available every month.

There are also resource lists of volunteers, those who have been trained on the equipment and may help you.

Our crew made use of a government suitcase studio. OCC or the public for future shoots could train a video crew to use the television van that will also serve as a studio on wheels. One of MetroVision staff will accompany the shoot.
