A proposal to replace the Clarenceville School District's aging bus fleet will be presented to the school board tonight, according to Ralph Skrocki, the district's new assistant superintendent for business

sistant superintendent for business affairs.
Skrocki replaced Edward Salisz, who retired last year.
"We have a five-year replacement program on paper at this time," Skrocki salid. "It will go to the superintendent (Michael Shibler) first and then to the board. We have quite a few buses that need quite a bit of work."

work."
Last month, Salisz said that of 15
buses in the fleet, 10 are between
seven and 12 years old.
He told the board two of the buses,
bought in 1975, have rusted to the

point where they will not pass a state vehicle inspection.

Two of the buses have mileage as tigh as 90,000 and 91,000. A third has traveled more than 100,000 miles, 8Krocki said.

"We do not put a bus on the road that is not safe. We are diligently working to have our buses in top shape," Strocki said, onling a full-time mechanic is making repairs and moving foward a preventive maintenance program. He added no accidents have occurred as a result of bus conditions.




