

Five people were hurt when a U.S. Postal Service mail truck and a car collided on Orchard Lake Road, south of Altadena, at 4:30 p.m. Jan. 28. The postal carrier, a 28-year-old Southfold woman, was treated at Providence Hospital, Southfield and released. The driver of the car, Margaret Chouinard, 35, of Huntington Woods, her daughter, Elizabeth, 8, and another child from Huntington Woods, Samantha Paterni, 6, were reported in stable condition Friday at Bostera General Hospital, Farmington Hills. Katie Chouinard, 1, was treated at Bots-

ford and released. The truck was southbound on Orchard Lake Road when the driver, in trying to stop for traffic, apparently veered left of the center line and struck the northbound car, Farmington Hills police said. Firefighters kept watch after the truck rolled over (above). The car continued north, then left the road's east side and struck a wood fence. The postal employee was ticketed for failure to maintain controf of a motor vehicle, police said.
