
CONTRA AID — By a vote of 211 for and 219 against, the House rejected legislation (HJ Res 444) to provide an additional \$36.2 million in non-lethial and military aid to the American-backed Contra army that

since 1981 has been fighting Nicara-gua's Marxist government.

The vote may have killed Presi-dent Reagan's policy to establish the Contra guerrillas as a formidable military force in Nicaragua.

The president said keeping the Contras battle-ready would force Ni-caragua to adhere to the democrat-ization requirements of the Central American peace plan. But critics of his policy agreed



with Costa Rican President Oscar Arias, chief architect of the peace process, that rearming the Contras would undercut ongoing efforts to moderate Mearagua's Marxist state moderate Mearagua's Marxist state of the Contras Members voting yet favored additional military and non-lethal aid to the contras. Republicans Carl Pursell of Plymouth and William Broomfield of Birmingham voted yes.

Voting no were Democrata Dennis Hertel of Harper Woods, William Ford of Taylor and Sander Levin of Southfield.

The bill gives them the same rights of notification and appeals to the Merit Systems Protection Board that apply to civil servants who took the competitive exam.

Supporter Frank Horton, R-N-Y., said it "isn't fair" for this category of workers to be denied the job rights in question.

Opponent Robert Walker, R-Pa., said the better solution is to stop exempting so many federal employees from the civil service exam.

Members voting yes favored the bill. Pursell, Hertel, Ford and Levin voted yes.

The Michigan Aeronautics Com-mission has approved \$1.2 million for improvements at two Oakland County airports.

It allocated \$1.16 million for Oak-land-Pontlac Airport, for resurfac-ing and marking runway 9R/27L, constructing blast pads, grading the

safety area and reimbursement for land acquired for hangar develop-

and acquired for hangar development.

The runway is breaking up and must be resurfaced, the state panel said. Two blast pads will control erosion at the ends of the runway.

It will be paid for by \$1.05 million in federal, \$50,200 in state and \$65,000 in county tunds.

For Oakland-Troy Airport, the state allocated a supplemental \$22,500 for constructing and maintain aparallel taxiowy approved in 1997. Half of the money comes from the state and half from county coffers.


