Educator: give kids skills to decide

Children as young as 5 can learn to be responsible for their decisions and their choices, Longacre Elemen-tary teacher Pat Baumunk said last week.

And parents are the ones who can best teach these skills, belging their children develop their self esteem and make the right choices, Bau-munk said, referring to information from the book "Peer Pressure Re-versal" by Sharon Scott.

"There are no magic answers,"
Baumunk said, "A lot of it is common sense, You cannot control what one other person does, including your children. You can only teach them the skills.

It suggests children be taught to: evaluate their situation, be aware of what is happening around them, and to apply the "trouble rule" of-fered by Scott in her book, asking themselves "could there be trouble?" or "will these actions hurt any-one?"
