## Forum focuses on small-business gains

Building on five years of work to make Michigan the best place in the nation to start and grow a business, the Governor's Conference on Small Business will mark the next step in making the state more attractive to entrepreneurs.

Three Farmington-area representatives will attend the conference, Feb. 25-26, in Lansing: Angel Bakos, Botsford Inn, public relations; Brace

Case, Farmington attorney, and Jonathan Grant, Farmington/Farmington Hills Chamber of Commerce president.

"During the past five years, we have worked closely with small business and our Entrepreneurial and Small Business Commission to successfully implement 34 initiatives, all with strong bipartisan legislative support," said Gov. James Blaine.

hard. "This conference will give us an additional forum to identify the needs and concerns of small business and set the agenda for the future."

About 97 percent of all companies in Michigan employ fewer than 50 people. More than 110,000 new businesses have been incorporated and 535,000 net new jobs have been added to Michigan's economy during the last five years, one of the largest in-

creases in the nation.

The two-day conference is the culmination of a series of six small business meetings held across the state last fall. Participants discussed a number of issues, including market opportunities, human investment, business/government initiatives, insurance, taxation and government regulation.
