## Music festival line-up listed

Farmington Community Center continues its "Festival of Music" series Feb. 28 with The David Jorlett Chorale.

Also scheduled to perform in the series are the Detroit Concert Brass March 20 and the Dennis Tini Quartet with George Benson on April 24. All of the concerts are presented at 7:30 p.m. Sundays followed by an "Artist's Reception."

According to Rob Striks, director of public relations for the center, "The overwhelming success of the fall music series prompted the continuation."

"The demand for this type of entertainment is very strong in our community as evident in the three previous sold-out performances," Striks said. "It's wonderful to be able to continue to offer this type of entertainment."

Striks credits the success of the concerts to the setting of the community center.

"It's refreshing to enjoy a concert in a nice room that only holds 100 or so people. After attending concerts at the Joe Louis Arena, Cobo Hall or even the Royal Oak Theater, you can really appreciate the intimacy of the center. Plus, because of the woodwork and the hardwood floors, the living room becomes a huge, acoustically sound speaker. You have to experience it."

The David Jorlett Chorale is a professional chorale of singers which specializes in the rich a cappella repertoire of the 16th through 20th

century. Known for their beauty of tone and blend, the chorale will perform songs and poetry of love and romance.

The chorale will share the stage with "Good Neighbors All," a Renaissance instrumental group that uses authentic musical instruments of the 16th and 17th centuries.

The cost of each performance and reception is \$13. Purchase of the series subscription is \$30, made by calling the community center at 477-8404.

The Farmington Community Center is a non-profit, independent organization that enhances the community with cultural events, programs and workshops. It is located on Farmington Road, north of 10 Mile.

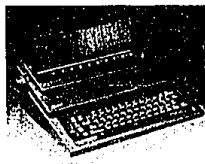

## DAR honors great patriot

George Washington was born Feb. 22, 1732, in Westmoreland County, Va. He was president of the Constitutional Convention and was elected the first president of the United States in 1789. The Quaker Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution honors this great patriot, known as the "Father of our Country." It urges citizens to celebrate the anniversary of his birthday.
