

# Dean, probate staffer, in running

Hugh E. Dean, manager of the estates and mental health divisions of the Oakland County Probate Court, has announced his candidacy for the probate judgeship opening up with the retirement of Norman R. Barnard.

The Bloomfield Township resident has been with the court for more than 10 years and before that was a trial attorney five years. His current work involves advising the bench, attorneys and residents on probate estate law, mental health, developmentally disabled and juvenile court procedures.

For the past two years, Dean has presented a seminar on probate procedures for the young attorneys section of the Oakland County Bar Association, participated on television and public radio programs on juvenile problems and minor guardianships and contributes frequently to the bar's monthly publication.

Dean is an adjunct professor in Mercy College's paralegal program and provides a bi-yearly seminar at Walsh College on fiduciary and probate accounting.

Besides being active in the bar association, Dean in 1986 formed a working committee with Clinton Valley Center which meets monthly to seek solutions for patients and families at CVC.

# Young entering '88 probate race

Joan E. Young, circuit court administrator, will run for probate judge in Oakland County, seeking the vacancy created by the retirement of Judge Norman R. Barnard.

The Birmingham resident has been court administrator since 1982 and prior to that was deputy for three years.

Earlier Young was in private practice with emphasis on juvenile law, domestic relations, wills and trusts, criminal and other litigation.

She earned a bachelor of arts from Michigan State University in 1969 and a law degree from Wayne State in 1974.

In 1983 she held an appointment from Gov. William Milliken to chair the State Teacher Tenure Commission. More recently, Chief Justice Dorothy Comstock Riley appointed her to the high court's task force on gender issues in the courts.

Young has been active in State Bar committees on trial court administration and plain English and chaired the Oakland Bar's task force on improved dispute resolution.

# Dog license deadline near

Monday is the deadline for buying dog licenses in Oakland County without paying a delinquent fee.

The fee for spayed or neutered animals is reduced from \$7.50 to \$5. As of March 1, there is a \$15 delinquent fee.

Carl Anderson, manager of the county's animal control shelter, said a license tag is "a lost dog's ticket home."

"Of the 13,000 dogs we handle yearly, less than 1 percent are returned to their owners," he said. "The license tag has on it all the information needed to contact the owner."

Licenses may be bought at municipal offices, the county treasurer's office or the county animal control division office.
