"We were the first congregation in the Detroit area to take one of the refuseniks as our person that we sponsored," Spectre said.

Sponsoring means that when a boy celebrates his Bar Mitzvah, the youth begins wearing a bracelet bearing a refusenik's name. The bracelet is worn until the refusenik is freed.

Until former refusenik Natan Sharansky was freed last year, the boys were given bracelets with his name. The girls were given bracelets bearing the name of Ida Nudel, known as "The Angel" for her work with other refuseniks in the Soviet Union. Nudel also has been freed.

The boys and girls also may

"THE RIDS have written letters and arranged calls," Spectre said.
"Sometimes, we have gotten through; more often, we haven't. Many of the letters never found their way to the refusenik. But they did get into the Russian post office."
But no one gives up the attempt. "In that way, these people (resueniks) couldn't disappear into a cell block and never be heard from again," Spectre said.
Over the years, a communications network has been established between supporters in the United States and refuseniks in the Soviet Union, Spectre said.
"In the carryl years, it was easier," Spectre said. "People going back and forth have sent messages. When Sharansky and Nudel were freed, we got a new name — Yull's."
