

Group predicts spring-like exhibit

Recreation thinks its carden exhibit in this year's Builders Home, Flower and Furniture Show will be its most ambitious yet. That's saying a lot because Parks and Recreation has been a participant in the show for close to 45

years.

The Builders show will be held March 19-27 at Cobo Hall.

"It will really look, feel and smell like spring at our exhibit," said Paul Hynes, superintendent of the Forestry and Landscapes Division of the city's Parks and Rec Department. foot-high blue snauce trees, which reach to the ceiling of the exhibit hall.

The trees were donated by Detroit esidents who found them too large for their property.

There will be over 500 azaleas, rhododendrons, tulips, byacinths and daf-fodils in the garden, along with more than 200 flowering shrubs all of which have been forced to bloom early at the Parks and Recreation's greenhouses on Belle Isle.

The highlight of the gorden will be a large 2,500-square-foot pond filled with

be 2 feet deep.

In the center of the pond will be a 20-foot-high, copper fountain, sculptured into a stylized-tree form. The fountain will have jets, which will spray water in several directions.

"It will feel like spring near our exhibit because of the constant water evaporation of the fountain. The evaporation will put water into the air. making it feel just like a cool spring breeze." Hynes added.

Three thousand feet of timber will

removed from city properties, for use in the construction of the pool retaining walls, ramps and decks. The timber will be cut at the department's saw mill on Belle Isle.

Six thousand yards of sand will be used to create a base for the landscape.

Thirty cubic yards of concrete will go into construction of the pond that's roughly enough concrete to form the curbs and sidewalks of two very long city blocks
