## Clay artistry on display at museum

"Power Over the Clay," at the Detroit Institute of Arts, continues through Sunday, April 17.
With 60 ceramics from the museum's own collection and loans from area collections, the exhibition spans the development in America of the studio pottery movement from beginnings in American art pottery to innovative contemporary forms.

The contemporary of the state of Michigan were hospitable territory for ceramicists and, consequently, developed a reputation for interested and informed collectors.

Mary Chase Perry Stratton, together with Horace J. Caulkins, established Detroit's Pewabic Pottery in 1903. Pewabic became nationally famus for its remarkable iridescent glazes and specially commissioned architectural tiles.

The exhibition is open to the public without charge in the DIA Textite Gallery during regular museum hours: 9:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Tuesday-Sunday, Closed Mondays and holidays.

With interest increasing in 20th-century decorative arts, the Modern Decorative Arts Group has been formed as a subsidiary of the Friends of Modern Art of the Founders Society Detroit Institute of Arts. Collectors Jerome and Patricia Shaw co-chair the group.

Its program addresses developments in decorative arts and design in all media (wood, glass, clay, metal, fiber).
