Trumpet and organ blend for concert

The triumphant sound of trumpet and organ will fill the sanctuary of Nardin Park United Methodist Church at a special Palm Sunday afternoon concert.

The fifth program in the church's Music Series, the concert promises to be a festive beginning to Holy Week observances, bringing together some outstanding musicians from around Michigan.

Dr. Dennis Horton will be featured on trumpet. He is professor of trumpet at Central Michigan University, where he also directs the brass choir. As a performer, Horton is a member of the Grand Rapids Symphony Orchestra, is principal trumpet of the Midland Symphony Orchestra, and plays first trumpet in the C.M.U. Faculty Brass Quintet. He has performed extensively throughout the U.S. as both a soloist and recitalist.

Joining Horton will be the C.M.U. Brass Ensemble, made up of five top students from the university.

Melvin Bookus, minister of music at Nardin Park, will be at the organ console. He has earned degrees in music at the University of Michigan and has an extensive background in

directing and performing both choral and instrumental music. As director of music at Nardin Park, he oversees a program with 200 participants in singing and handbell choirs. In addition to joining with the trumpets on several pieces, Bookus will be performing the organ solo, "Toccata, Fugue, and Chaconne" by Dietrich Buxtehude.

Featured works for trumpet and organ will include compositions by Bach, Telemann, Vivaldi, and Purcell. Of special interest will be "Suite for Six Trumpets," written by Horton. The music was selected for its ceremonial and joyous spirit.

As a further enhancement to the musical events, the Nardin Park Rangers handbell choir will be performing two selections.

The public is invited to the concert at 4 p.m. Sunday, Nardin Park is at 2887 11 Mile. There is no admission charge, but a free-will offering will be taken.
