## New pamphlet gives help for teen parents

A new Oakland Community College pamphlet, "Break the Pattern," has been published to assist teen parents with the management of their lives and the lives of their born or unborn babies.

The publication encourages teen parents to take control of their own lives and avoid the paths taken by many young parents that force them and their children into a life of poverty, welfare and dependence on others. It provides teens with nine pages of addresses and telephone numbers listed in categories for easy identification of the service needed. Teens are able to choose from among such areas as counseling, legal services, financial assistance, residence halls, health services and educational programs.

The pamphlets are available from local school districts in Oakland County, all OCC campuses and social service agencies in the county.

## Health-O-Rama returns here April 13

Mercy Center has been designated as one of the 80 sites for Project Health-O-Rama 1988. Sponsored by Blue Cross Blue Shield of Michigan, WKYC-TV, Channel 7, and the United Health Organization, Project Health-O-Rama offers health screening to anyone 18 years of age or older.

Health-O-Rama in Mercy Center, 28050 Grand River, will offer health screening to the community from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Wednesday, April 13. Tests offered include height and weight, vision, blood pressure, glaucoma, counseling, referral and the optional blood panel test, 21 tests for

\$10 and colorectal cancer screening kits for \$3.

Special tests will include oral-dental, skin cancer, podiatry and hearing.

Volunteers from local nursing schools, allied health schools, hospital and community organizations will participate. Project Health-O-Rama is meant to alert individuals of possible health problems, and to encourage and heighten public awareness of health prevention and health education.
