

Ask Citizen Support For Sexuality Training

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TWO YEARS ago, the Family Life Education (FLE) citizens committee was formed to investigate, evaluate and recommend a program of human sexuality instruction. Blumberg continued.

A recommendation was made to the school board by the FLE committee, Blumberg added, "because the time had come for Farmington to join the rest of the enlightened communities and put sex education into the curriculum."

Thirteen persons served on the FLE and made that recommendation last June, Blumberg told a hushed and attentive audience.

"Carl and I believe that the time has come for the community to rise and implement the program which has been developed."

NOTING THAT the YMCA program was the only sexuality instruction offered in Farmington, Blumberg stressed: "The community will not be responsible for any program for this age group."

"The time has come for citizens to let the school board know that five months is long enough for the FLE report to sit and gather dust."

Blumberg urged parents to write letters to the school board, work through the PTAs and have discussions with building principals.

"If next year, the seventh and eighth graders have no program at all it will be because we as citizens have failed," Blumberg told parents.

KALTRIEDER commented that the school board for some time now has had the state guidelines on human sexuality instruction in addition to having the "honest, sensible and workable" FLE guidelines for five months.

The school board has done nothing to implement the results of the FLE's many months of work, Kaltrieder continued. "The responsibility now must be yours and that of your neighbors."

Both Kaltrieder and Blumberg served on the FLE committee, Kaltrieder working specifically on drug abuse education guidelines and Blumberg on the human sexuality task force.

"I don't feel badly about the seven years I've spent on the YMCA human sexuality program," says Kaltrieder, "because there have been some real benefits realized,

for both me and the students. "But I am beginning to regret having served 14 months on the FLE and then

have our recommendations ignored for five months. I trust that not all of that time was wasted."

Music Greet FHS Holidays

FARMINGTON Two concerts in the holiday mood are coming up at Farmington High School.

The first is a concert of vocal music at 3 p.m. Dec. 6 in the school auditorium. Tickets are \$1 for adults, students free, and can be purchased at the door.

THE PROGRAM will include the Girls Choir singing a selection by Bach, traditional carols and a Pennsylvania Dutch folk song: the Concert Choir in "Lo, A Rose" (Palestrina), "We Thank Thee" (Bortolinsky), "Old Abram Brown" (Brittill) three Hungarian folksongs and "Alleluia" (Boyer).

The Falcoires will sing "Lo, A Voice" (Bortolinsky), "Bring A Torch" (Shaw), and a contemporary piece for speaking chorus, "Geographical Fugue" (Toch).

A presentation by the Twelve Tones will include selections from "A Ceremony of Carols" (Britten), and a contemporary work joined in by the Falcoire girls, all accompanied on the harp by Kay Klein, a student at North Farmington High School.

THE CONCERT on Dec. 13 will feature the concert choir and the concert orchestra. Tickets are \$1 for adults, 50 cents for students and can be purchased at the door.

The concert choir will sing selections from "The Gloria" (Vivaldi), accompanied by the orchestra. Soloists in the number will include Cindy Strey, Debby Watson and Lorraine Manz.

In addition to other works, the orchestra will perform Mozart's "G Minor Symphony No. 40."

The choirs are under the direction of Harold S. Kacnek. A graduate of Eastman School of Music, he is in his first year at FHS. He taught in the music history department at the University of Michigan before coming here.

The orchestra is under the direction of George N. Heller, who has taught instrumental music at FHS for two years. He holds bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of Michigan.

The concert choir numbers about 35 students, the orchestra about 20 string and woodwind players.

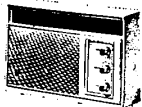
On Duty

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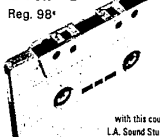
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Hair'n Around

To find out which colors do most for you, stand at well-lighted mirror, place different swatches at neckline. See what lights up skin, brings out hair and eye color.

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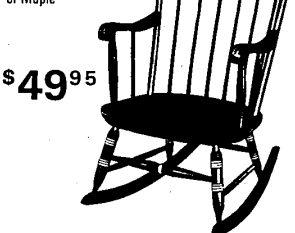
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
