So why did it take the manufacturer Marry so long to come out with
its line of Indric markers? We're not
sure, but the line is finally developed
to the point where it comes in 12 colors and costs \$2.75 per marker. This
is a larger marker with a pointed
nib. The ink does not need to be heat
set, writes on any material, is water
and chlorine resistant and finally is
mon-taxic. BUT DON'T LIMIT your thinking to just T-shirts. Lamp shades, pil-lows, tennis shoes, canvas bags and more are all screaming for an artis-tic splash of color.

"Fabric Fun" by Pentel is a real easy way for kids to color their shirts. These little sticks are pastel dyes. They also are permanent on clothes and fabrics. Just use them like a crayon, then when you are finished drawing, you must heat set (simple ironing) before you wash the garment. These really work. A set of seven is only \$1.20 and a set of 15 is \$2.29.

\$2.29. Before I go on I must say that any acrylic paint is permanent on fabric. The problem with even thin acrylics is that when the paint drice, it becomes still in the material, Liquitex recommends the addition of a small amount of "gloss medium and varnish" into the paint for permanence. Grumbacher recommends that if one wishes to airbrush with acrylics on material, the paint should be thinned with alcohol.

In my mind, all fabric paints are in some way inferior to Dekn fabric dyes. The dyes are rich, completely permanent and come in a wide range of colors tackling fluorescents and metallies. Pearl is one of my favorites because any color you add to it takes on an irridescence. Even wittes are greatly helped by the presence of pearl.



Deka dyes stay soft in the material so even large, solid colors just look like dyed areas instead of crusty painted area. These colors need to be heat set. This merely means turning the item inside out and ironing. Deka dyes are waterbased, non-stiffening, non-fading, machine washable and dry cleanable. And can be used on all types of light-colored fabrics. The most popular size is \$1.165, but it does come in large sizes.

THE "IRON-ON" feature makes it possible to paint or airbrush on pa-per and then allows for the transfer of your art with heat to the material. The most popular member of the

Deka family is "Perma Air," a prethined mixture of Deka dyes (2% ounces for \$2.79). The eye-dropper fliptop makes it ideal for airbrushing.

I have had customers bring in their wearable pieces of art and I, an amazed at the results. As I mentioned, at the Art Store & More, we teach airbrushing of fabric, I have seen students bring in wearables with other brands of fabric point but nothing as yet compares with Deka.


