

Harrison boys 2nd in Relays

Farmington Harrison won five track and field events Saturday and finished second in a close battle for the boys championship of the Milan Relays.

The Hawks, who excelled in the field events, were three points behind first-place Belleville (87) and three ahead of third-place Pinckney (81).

Harrison won the high jump, shot put and discus relays and was second in the long jump with key contributions from Wes Wood, Brian Soeder, Mark Bonasso, Dave Gurke and Joe George.

Bob Conlon was the star of the high jump, however. He jumped 6 feet, 4 inches and was supported by Wood and Soeder, both of whom reached the height of 6-2.

IT WAS SOEDER and Wood again in the long jump, teaming up with George for second place. Soeder leaped 21-1 1/4, Wood 18-3 and George 17-8.

George combined with Bonasso and Gurke to win the discus, and Bonasso (36-7), Gurke (41-11) and Blazo Sarcevic (37-11) captured top billing in the shot put.

Harrison's other victories came in the 600-meter and distance medley relays. With each team member running a mile, Chris Hart, Pat Runk, David Foss and Dan Budzinski were the former in 19:10.0, and the same foursome also won the latter. Burgess ran 800 meters in 2:03.0, Hart 400 meters in 54.1, Foss 1,200 meters in 3:26.0 and Runk 1,600 meters in 4:51.0.

The Hawks also were second in the 3,200-meter relay, with the same four runners clocking 8:35.0.

HARRISON'S girls team didn't have any first places but scored in all 13 events. The Hawks' best finishes were a pair of seconds in the sprint medley and 800-meter relays. Kamela Malosh, Nivvin Haklin, Stacey Roemer and Maria Chalognis combined for a 1:54.6 in the 800, and Haklin, Tracey Radke, Malosh and Roemer posted a 2:02.3 time in the sprint medley.

Harrison had four third-place finishes: Radke, Lanell Shoemaker and Malosh in the high jump (13-9); Almee Jarvenpaa, Radke and Jo Rosenthal in the shot put (74-7); Nicole Leo, Jarvenpaa, Michelle Rabtoy and Chalognis in the shuttle

hurdle (1:16.3); and Chalognis, Leo, Elizabeth Tucker and Shoemaker in the middle distance relay (7:23.7).

The Hawks also were fourth in the 3,200-meter relay with Tucker, Shoemaker, Jodi Watson and Joanne Hannawa (11:29.7); the 400 relay with Malosh, Haklin, Roemer and Radke (54.98); and the coed relay with Chalognis, Roemer, Bob Chausamp and Aaron Yavarski (2:49.7).

Haklin, Lita Floyd and Kristen Walsh gave Harrison fifth in the long jump, and the Hawks were sixth in the discus with Jarvenpaa, April Jones and Rosenthal; the 400 relay with Jeannie Klotzer, Jenny Carpenter, Rosenthal and Sonja Magdeski; and the distance medley with Hannawa, Walsh, Klotzer and Magdeski.

AT THE BLOOMFIELD HILLS Andover Relays, a coed meet in which boys and girls compete on the same relay teams in all events, North Farmington scored in six events Saturday.

The Raiders' highest finish was fourth in the running relay for shot putters and discus throwers. Doug Cohen, Ginger Donoghue, Zalm Cummalaj and Suzi Butcher comprised the foursome.

Butcher and Cummalaj also were on the discus and shot put teams that took fifth place. Cindy Cramer and Todd Pawlowski were the other half of the discus team, and Donoghue and Cohen completed the shot put unit.

In addition, Jason Biederman, Lisa Rives, Jeff Simpson and Donna Chuba were fifth in the eight-mile relay.

North also had a pair of sixth places from Donoghue, Amy Gallus, Chad Henry and Eric Carlson in the high jump and Jim Nader, Karen Zelenko, Brett Willis and Julie Garczynski in the 3,200 relay.

Even though he was the losing coach, Wayne Mancoske's Joe Grasley called it "the greatest high school track meet I've ever been associated with in my 25 years."

On Tuesday, host Monroe held to score a 68-54 victory over the Zehras, who lost for the first time in three dual meets.

"By the time we got down to the 1,600 relay, we had nothing left," Grasley said. "We had hoped to get them earlier."

Tim Pitcher was the hero for Monroe, winning the 800 and 1,600-meter relays in 1:59.1 and 4:50.2, respectively. He also anchored the winning 1,600 and 3,200 relay squads.

Not to be outdone was Wayne's Tony Robertson, who set a school record of 10.71, breaking the mark held since 1959 by Ernie Righetti. Robertson also won the 200 dash (22.8) and anchored the winning 400 relay team that also included Tony Faison, Dave Rodriguez and Corey Wilson (44.1).

Steve Heardon also figured in three firsts for Wayne. He won the 400 run (50.4) and 300 intermediate hurdles (41.3), while teaming up with Rodriguez, Rodriguez and Wilson to grab first in the 800 relay in 1:33.1.

Wilson and Heardon went one-two in the 110 high hurdles with times of 14.4 and 14.9, respectively.

Wendell Smith cleared 6 feet, 4 inches to win the high jump for Wayne, while teammate Shawn Wallace added a first in the shot put (43-11).

But a heroic effort was turned in by Wayne's Derrick Allen, who took second in the 800 (2:04.0) and 3,200 (9:35.1), along with a third in the 1,600 (4:52.0).

Glenn, Wayne succeed in weekend track action

Both Westland John Glenn and Wayne Memorial made noise on the boys track circuit last weekend.

Glenn captured the Dearborn Elks Relays held at Redford Thurston High School, scoring 42 points. Plymouth Salem was second with 38.

Other area schools in the 12-team field included Redford Catholic Central, fifth place, 29; Livonia Stevenson, sixth, 22; Livonia Franklin, seventh, 15; Plymouth Canton, 10th, 10.

Wayne, meanwhile, won the shuttle hurdle relay at the prestigious Mansfield (Ohio) Relays, a meet that attracted more than 150 schools from the Midwest and Ontario.

Running logs of 110 meters each, seniors Steve Heardon, Corey Wilson, Julio Desir and Junior Wendell Smith recorded a first-place time of 1:01.3.

Heardon added a sixth in the 300 intermediate hurdles (38.8) and Wilson was sixth in the 110 high hurdles (14.6). Heardon was running second in the 300 hurdles before tripping, eventually falling four places back.

"Steve had the second best preliminary time and I thought he would get first until that last hurdle," said Wayne coach Joe Grasley.

Wayne also added a ninth in the 400 relay, as Heardon, Wilson, senior Tony Robertson and Junior Tom Faison were clocked in 43.8.

MEANWHILE, GLENN placed in 11 of 14 events to gain the Elks crown.

The Rockets captured two events and finished second in three others.

The team of Kevin Wilson, Gino Crenshaw, Andy Dobbins and Marcus Lowe took the 800-meter re-

lay in 1:33.32. The Rockets got some help when Detroit Cody's quartet was disqualified for passing the baton out of the exchange zone.

Glenn, however, won against both Salem and Cody in the 400 relay, as Lowe, Crenshaw, Dobbins and Steve Valetti were clocked in 44.1.

"I didn't know if we'd score enough in the field events because some of our kids couldn't go because they were taking the ACT test," said Glenn second-year coach Richard Gordon. "But the kids did an excellent job. It was our first real test and we ran six sophomores. I was really pleased with their effort along with some of our veterans."

Individually, sophomore Dave Ryan cleared 5 feet, 10 inches to help Glenn gain second in the high jump relay. Ryan and teammate Matt Maybauer, another sophomore, each ran legs of 4:50.0 (1,600 meters

each) to help give the Rockets second behind Plymouth Canton in the 6,400 relay. The Rockets also took second behind Cody in the 1,600 relay.

THERE WAS ALSO a bit of nostalgia going for Gordon.

"I went to Thurston and grew up in Redford and I told the team that I never lost a meet when I was there and I never lost a meet there when I coached at Cherry Hill," he said. "I guess that was an omen. It was quite a meet for our program."

Redford CC captured two events, the high jump relay at 17-6 (Tom Elfrid, Aaron Romain, Tom Murie) and the high hurdle relay in 1:07.61 (John Masterson, Doug Talbot, Jim Pater, Jeff Sebuck).

Stevenson grabbed the shot put relay as Nick Petouhoff, Joe Shymanski, Dan Gutekunst and Mike Nettie combined for 184.4.

Salem captured the discus relay with Jay Blaylock, who tossed an individual best of 158-7, combining with Romelo Maura and Kurt Feller for a first place total of 405-10.

In fact, that was the last event, and Salem's victory vaulted the Rockets from fourth to second place.

"I went into the day a little apprehensive," Salem coach Gary Balcon said. "I knew the kids would run hard, but it was our first meet and I wasn't sure how we would match up."

"What's really nice is we scored in 11 of the 13 events. The kids showed a real nice balance."

"We kicked and scratched, and when they added it up we were right there," he added.

In the long jump relay, Salem's Lamar Crayton and an individual best of 21-4, but Franklin's Gary Hudgins, Jeff Dudek and Roy Hall enjoyed a team best of 59-24.

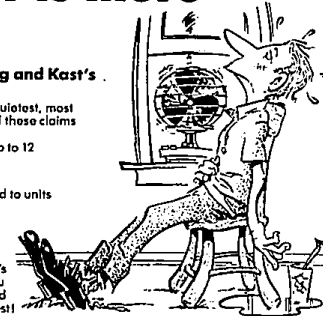
