

Big day for Farmington girls track teams

Farmington schools made it a clean sweep in girls track as all four teams claimed victory in dual meets last week. On Wednesday, undefeated Merins runs its record to 4-0 with an 87-41 victory over Harper Woods Bishop Gallagher. The Marlins are 2-0 in the Central Division.

It was the public school teams' turn on Thursday. Farmington, also perfect (2-0) dual meets, thumped Westland John Glenn 81-47 in its Lakes Division opener. North Farmington topped Walled Lake Central 69-59 and Harrison routed Walled Lake Western 94-34.

MERCY 87, GALLAGHER 41: The Marlins swept the relays, and they dominated the field events and distance runs.

Adanna Amanza, Bonita Brown and Michelle Smith were on the 440- and 880-yard relay teams. Along with Kim Cook in the former and Sue Mellow in the latter, the Marlins were clocked at 54.7 in the 440 and 1:56.6 in the 880.

Laurie Hood, Mollie Tenbusch, Megan Lombardi and Mary Beth Strand captured

the mile relay in 4:41.0, and Kathleen Greig, Heather Sullivan, Carrie Walton and Nicole Gates combined for a 10:42.0 time in the two-mile race.

Meroy won the three longest runs with Gates taking the 880 in 2:47.0, Brigitte Dery the mile in 6:04.0 and Debbi Cole the two-mile in 13:38.0.

The Marlins won three of the four field events. Charese Sanders won the shot put (34-3) and Jeanette Turner the discus (94-6 1/4). Gail Murie, Hood and Walton tied for first place in the high jump (4-6).

FARMINGTON 81, GLENN 47: Kristi Devine, a double winner in the field events, broke her own school record in the shot put with a winning loss of 34.9. The old mark was 34.2.

Devine also won the discus (112-1 1/4) and teammate Julie Lavton the high jump (4-8). The Falcons also had a couple personal bests in the field events. Freshman Shellie Gaud was second in the high jump (4-6), and freshman Kerri Owszarak was runner-up in the shot put (31-8).

Gaul won the 100-meter hurdles in 18.1, and Farmington was too tough to beat in the sprints. Jo Fox captured the 100 dash in 15.13, Carrie Maler the 200 in 28.37 and Army Trunk the 400 in 1:08.5.

All four were instrumental in the Falcons sweeping the relays. Maler, Fox, Gaul and Angie Forge won the 400 in 54.2, and Maler, Trunk, Nicole Tocco and Forge took the 800 in 1:57.4.

Jeff Kierl, who won the 1,600 run with a 5:52.1 time, anchored the winning 3,200 relay team, and Trunk did the same in the 1,600.

Maureen O'Dell, Gretchen Clappison and Bonnie Stecker preceded Kierl in the 3,200 in which the Falcons had a 10:57.9 time, and Carrie Miller, Kristi Bodary and Jennifer Derwinski teamed up with Trunk for a 4:53.0 time in the 1,600.

HARRISON 94, W.L. WESTERN 34: The Hawks, 2-0 in dual meets, dominated everything but the field events, as the opened Western Division competition with a convincing win.

Maria Chalognais won both hurdles races and anchored two relays. Stacey Roemer won the 200 dash (28.4) and was on three winning relays. Kamala Malosh captured the 100 dash (13.6) and participated in two relay victories as did Lanell Shoemaker, who won the 400 dash (1:08.3).

Other individual winners, Tracy Delbusto in the 800 run (2:50.6) and Sonja Magdevski in the 3,200 run (14:22.0), were on one relay team.

Chalognais won the 100 hurdles in 17.7 and led a Harrison sweep that saw Jane Peters finish second and Amy Jarvenpaa third. Chalognais finished the 300 hurdles contest in 51.8. Peters was second.

The same two combined with Malosh and Roemer to win the 800 relay in 1:58.3, and Peters, Shoemaker, Roemer and Chalognais stopped the clock at 4:39.0 in the 1,600 relay.

Malosh, Nivin Hakim, Roemer and Tra-

cy Radke won the 400 relay in 56.2, and Shoemaker, Delbusto, Joanna Hannawa and Magdevski recorded an 11:43.0 time in the 3,200 relay.

N. FARMINGTON 69, W.L. CENTRAL 59: The Raiders swept three events and won the meet despite the Vikings winning all four relays.

Two of those sweeps occurred in the field events. Sui Butcher had two firsts and led the sweep of the discus. She won the shot with a throw of 33 feet, 11 1/2 inches and the discus at a distance of 108 feet, 5 inches.

North, 1-0 in the Lakes Division and 1-1 overall, also captured all three places in the high jump, which Julie Galckis won with a jump of 4 feet, 6 inches.

Sandra Schmitt won the 100 dash, the third event in which the Raiders dominated, in 13.7.

Lisa Rives also was a double winner with first place in the 1,600 run (5:50.06) and the 3,200 run (19:05.38). Amy Gallus won the 400 dash in 1:08.61.

Hawk trio pace win over Walled Lake Western

The Farmington Harrison trio of Bob Conlon, Wood and Brian Soeder proved too much for host Walled Lake Western Thursday in boys track action.

Harrison, 2-0 in dual meets, defeated Western 88-49 in a Western Division meet at Conlon, Wood and Soeder won individual events outright. The threesome also tied for first in the high jump (5-8).

Conlon also was a member of Harrison's 400-meter relay team that placed first in 48.7.

Conlon's first-place finish came in the 110 hurdles at 15.4. Wood's time of 41.0 won the 300 hurdles, and it came in weather not suited for running. Conlon and Soeder drew praise for their efforts in both the field and running events.

"It was a very cold, windy and rainy day and given those conditions

they both did very well," Harrison coach John Schumacher said. "It was an average day for both of them. They're both very good hurdlers and just very solid performers."

Also earning titles for Harrison were Blazo Sarcevlch, who threw the shot put 40-2; Mark Bonasso, whose toss of 138-3 won the discus; Soeder, who tossed 49-3 in the long jump; and Brian Monahan, who placed first in the 100 meters at 12.0.

Members of the 400 relay team included Conlon, Rich Esker, Joe George and Jeff Peterson. The 3,200 relay team also earned first with a time of 9:05, and it included Pat Runk, Chris Hart, Rick Ebbell and Dave King.

67: Warren Johnson excelled for North Farmington as the Raiders won Thursday by a narrow margin over host Walled Lake Central.

Johnson won one field event, the long jump — and later took titles in the 100, 200 and 400 races.

Johnson's leap of 19-3 won the long jump. He finished the 100 in 11.5, clocked 24.0 in the 200 and

completed the 400 in 52.4. Zaim Cuminafaj placed first in both the shot put and discus events, throwing the weights 44-9 1/2 and 143-3, respectively.

Harrison also was successful in the relay events, winning both the 400 and 800 races. The team of Mark Leaning, Pat Turner, Doug Cohen and Jorlie Greenstein won the 400 in 47.9 and the 800 in 1:38.0.

JOHN GLENN 95, FARMINGTON 42: Host Farmington won two field events Thursday, but Westland John Glenn's dominance in the running events spelled the difference as

the Rockets won easily. Farmington slipped to 2-2 overall.

Mike Neal and Doug MacLeod won the discus and pole vault events, respectively, for Farmington. Neal threw the discus 127-3, and MacLeod jumped 9-6 in the vault.

Also recording a first for Farmington was the 800-run team of Bill Lindberg, Joe Crow, Dave Wiley and Nick Maisel. The foursome crossed the line at 1:35.4.
