On or about May 19, 1988 the above-named city of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, will request the U.S. Dept. of Housing and Urban Development to release Federal funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (PL 93-383) for the following project:

An Environmental Review Record respecting the within project has been made by the above-named Farmington Hills, Oakland County, which documents the environmental review of the project. TO ALL INTERESTED AGENCIES, GROUPS AND PERSONS:
On or about May 23, 1988 the above-named Farmington Hills, Oakland County will request the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to release Federal funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (PL 93-383) for the following project: Meadowbrook Hgts. Storm Drain which includes the installation of approximately 2100 linear feet of storm drain pipe in the Eight Mile and Middlebelt road area.

It has been determined that such request for release of funds will not constitute an action significantly affecting the quality of the human environment and accordingly, the above-named Farmington Hills, Oakland Co. has decided not to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (PL 91-190).

The reasons for such decision not to prepare such Statement are as follows: The proposed project will require only minor alterations to the landscape and will not destroy or interrupt natural features of the surrounding environment, such as but not limited to water courses or wildlife.

An Environmental Review Record respecting the within project has been made by the above-named Farmington Hills, Oakland Co., which documents the environmental review of the project and more fully sets forth the reasons why such Statement is not required. This Environmental Review Record is on file at the above address and is available for public examination and copying, upon request at the Planning office between the hours of 8:30 A.M. and 4:30 P.M.

No further environmental review of such project is proposed to be conducted prior to the request for release of Federal funds.

All interested agencies, groups and persons disagreeing with this decision are invited to submit written comments for consideration by the City of Farmington Hills, Oakland Co. to the City Manager at 31555 W. Eleven Mile Road, Farmington Hills, MI 48018 on or before May 20, 1988. All such comments so received will be considered and the City of Farmington Hills, Oakland Co. will not request the release of Federal funds or take any administrative action on the within project prior to the date specified in the preceding sentence.
