Dunkel Offering 2 Concerts

Sealed bids for the purchase of tax anticipation notes of Farmington Public School District, County of Oakland, Michigan, of the par value of \$500,000.00 will be received by the undersigned at the 3250 Shawcross, Farmington, Michigan, until 7:00 p.m., Eastern Standard Time on the 14th day of December 1970, at which time and place they will be publicly opened and read.

The notes will be dated December 18, 1970, will mature January 18, 1971 and will bear interest at a rate or rates not exceeding 8% per annum. Both principal and interest will be payable at a bank or trust company located in the State of Michigan to be designated by the original purchaser of the notes which having agent qualifies as such under the Statutes of the State of Michigan or of the Federal Government, subject to the approval of the Farmington School District. For the purpose of awarding the notes the interest cost of each bid will be computed by determining, at the rate or rates specified therein, the total dollar value of all interest on the notes from December 18, 1970, to their maturity and deducting therefrom any premium. The notes will be awarded to the bidder whose bid on the above computation produces the lowest interest cost to the municipality. No interest on the purchase of less than all of the notes or at a price less than their par value will be considered.

The tax on anticipation of the operating portion of the school tax for the fiscal year of July 1, 1970 to June 30, 1971, which tax is due and payable December 1, 1970.

A certified or cashier's check in the amount of 2% of the par value of the notes, drawn upon an incorporated bank or trust company and payable in the order of the Treasurer must accompany each bid as a guarantee of good faith on the part of the bidder to be forfeited in the event of default of the bidder to accept the notes and to pay for the notes. Checks of unsuccessful bidders will be promptly returned.

Bids shall be conditioned upon the unqualified opinion of the purchaser's attorney approving the legality of the notes, to be secured at the purchaser's expense. The purchaser shall furnish notes ready for execution at his expense. Notes will be delivered at a place to be agreed upon with the purchaser. The right is reserved to reject any and all bids.
